
Dear Families,

## **EYFS - Nursery**

Nursery have been busy bees this week, playing, exploring and learning during what will be the final half term in Nursery for some! We have been busy practising our fantastic maths skills by singing songs like '1, 2, 3, 4, 5, once I caught a fish alive' and using our knowledge and understanding of cardinality and counting to subitise different amounts of fish in the pond!

In our English lessons, we've been working hard perfecting our rhyming skills. We love listening to rhyming stories, joining in with the repeated refrains and anticipating the rhyming words. We've even been playing games of 'silly soup', where we each took in in turns to add the rhyming pairs into the cauldron!



We've also enjoyed joining in with our special 'Celebrating Differences' day! We listened to lots of lovely stories which encouraged us to think about our own uniqueness before we made delicious crispy cakes to sell as part of our school's cake sale!



## Reception



This week, Reception Class discovered a mystery parcel had arrived into our class. The parcel was littered with posters which explained it had come from the South Pole and if found, we must return it! After making some predictions, we discovered a tiny, fluffy penguin inside and a new story called 'Lost and Found'. Since then, the children have been busy creating banks of adjectives and creating their own 'Found' posters in hopes of finding the penguins rightful owner!



In our RE lessons, we've been hearing about the coming of the Holy Spirit! We've enjoyed listening to stories, asking

questions about what we wonder about the Holy Spirit, and thinking about how we can spread the good news just like Jesus' disciples. In our RE lessons, we've been using bubbles, we watched as the bubbles floated around, spreading far and wide and thought about how this was similar to sharing the good news - how far can our message be heard?







Year 1

During the last couple of weeks, the children in Year 1 have been working very hard in preparation for their phonics screening check that they completed this week. The children have been exloring both real words and alien words. To do this, they've identified special friends, they then fred talk and finally read the words. Despite some challenges the children have perserveered and worked very hard. Well done Year 1.



In English the children are reading the text 'Billy and the Beast' by Nadia Shireen with Miss Parry. The children have worked together with a partner to consider what type of character Billy is. They consider her thoughts and feelings as well as her actions. The lesson was very active and the children enjoyed writing their ideas on a post-it notes and then sticking it on a large picture of the character. Once they had explored lots of ideas with their partner, they then had the opportunity to share their ideas and explain their thinking to the rest of the class.







Year 2

Year 2 have had a fabulous couple of weeks. We loved going on our trip to celebrate winning the spring term attendance award. We got the coach to exhibition park and played in the sunshine, and then made our way to the Great North Museum for lunch and an afternoon session. We learnt so much about animals and food chains.

What a wonderful day we had for celebrating difference day. The children enjoyed creating bunting flags for each other and asking questions to find out about their personalities.



We had a music session learning all about the bagpipes and created some music together.



We're looking forward to the next few weeks of the summer term.





Year 3

We've had a lovely couple of weeks, especially with the weather turning nicer.

We celebrated 'Difference Day' where we looked at diversity using the book, Mixed. We thought carefully about equality, discrimination and what makes us special









In science, we've been carrying out our topic based on plants. We've been looking at the conditions needed for plants to grow and growing our own plants. We've looked at the parts of a flower and

their job. We enjoyed using clay to make models of these.

We completed our Pentecost RE topic, and we had a beautiful liturgy looking at new life and spreading the Good News.

The Design Technology days were great, where we learnt about seasonal foods and then we designed and made our own seasonal tarts. They were delicious!

Clued Up Kids came into school to teach us about healthy eating. We looked at having a balanced diet and what would be good to have in our packed lunch.

Year 5




you will be taken from what is mine'."
