A huge thank you to the Friends of St. Joseph's for all the time and effort they put into organising such a fun and memorable event. We truly appreciate everything you do for our school community!


We all thoroughly enjoyed Sports Day - it was a fantastic afternoon filled with fun, energy, and team spirit! Despite a brief

It was lovely to welcome our families into school to cheer us on and share in the excitement. Thank you to everyone who helped make the day so special!


In science, we've been learning all about materials and their properties.

We are so proud of everything they have achieved and know they are more than ready for the next step in their learning journey. Well done, Year 1!























Year 2

Year 4

A lovely and very busy couple of weeks for year 4. Some of us received their first Holy Communion



and we had a beautiful class mass delivered by Father. We also lots of fun at our disco and had an amazing sports day.

In maths we have been looking at time. We began the topic with a re-cap of our previous knowledge



working in pairs to show the correct times on the clock. We have then looked at the digital clocks and converting to the 12-hour clock to the 24 hour and back again.

In science we have been studying sates of matter and have carried out a range of experiments, including melting points. We prepared three different solids, including chocolate, ice and butter in bowls and went outside to observe which one would be the first to begin to melt in the sun. We have also looked at evaporation and condensation, using cups of water in two different conditions.

In English we have been looking at the features of writing a non-chronological report, in preparation of completing our own about a Yeti form our book The Abominables. We worked in pairs to look at a variety of reports and label the features that they used to inform the reader. We then looked at a wide range of paragraphs and came up with appropriate subheadings.

Year 4 had a fantastic afternoon learning about finance from the kind people of NatWest Bank.

The children learned how to budget for a party. Working in groups they managed to set a budget, identify their expenditure and judge who would deliver the best party based on a number of criteria. All in all, a great afternoon.













Year 5

In Year 5, we recently finished writing poetry based on Lewis Carroll's 'Jabberwocky'. We had such fun with portmanteau and rhythm.

We had a very interesting and useful 'MoneySense' workshop kindly provided by NatWest Bank. The children looked at potential scam scenarios and learning about fraud. The end of the session was particularly exciting when we looked at fake bank notes!

This week culminated in a trust-wide 'Celebration of Sport' at Gateshead International Stadium. The children took part in athletics, multi sports and a dance session. Well done everybody!

















Year 6

Year 6 had an amazing time away for our residential at Allensford YMT. On the first evening, we ate together, settled into our rooms and completed an activity while we got to know the staff and pupils from other schools.

The second day began with a lovely start to our day as Y6 had a fabulous morning starting with breakfast, playing in the sunshine and completing a carousel of activities!

In the afternoon, Y6 completed a range of



activities including a STEM activity which involved working together to create a vessel to protect a water balloon when dropped. This was followed by a beautiful walk through the countryside where we connected with nature by utilising our senses. Y6 have finished their second amazing day with a movie night! Before then they'd completed an escape room challenge and spend time playing in the sunshine!

For our last activity, Y6 were designing planets. We either worked on our own planet or worked in groups if we wanted to. We then presented our planets with pupils from other schools and staff voted on what they thought was best. Every did so well and we thoroughly enjoyed applying our creative skills to the activity!

Since returning, we have enjoyed a DT day where we designed and create our own keyrings using sewing techniques. We were excellent at learning different stitching techniques and applying our learning to our own creation.





Jubilee Year 2025

Does the following piece of writing by Pope Leo (written before he became the pope) strike a cord with you?

" Brothers, sisters...

I speak to you, especially to those who no longer believe, no longer hope, no longer pray, because they think God has left.

To those who are fed up with scandals, with misused power, with the silence of a Church that sometimes seems more like a palace than a home.

I, too, was angry with God.

I, too, saw good people die, children suffer, grandparents cry without medicine.

And yes... there were days when I prayed and only felt an echo.

But then I discovered something:

God doesn't shout. God whispers.

And sometimes He whispers from the mud, from pain, from a grandmother who feeds you without having anything.

I don't come to offer you perfect faith.

I come to tell you that faith is a walk with stones, puddles, and unexpected hugs.

I'm not asking you to believe in everything.

I'm asking you not to close the door. Give a chance to the God who waits for you without judgment.

I'm just a priest who saw God in the smile of a woman who lost her son... and yet she cooked for others.

That changed me.

So if you're broken, if you don't believe, if you're tired of the lies... come anyway. With your anger, your doubt, your dirty backpack. No one here will ask you for a VIP card.

Because this Church, as long as I breathe, will be a home for the homeless, and a rest for the weary.

God doesn't need soldiers. He needs brothers.

And you, yes, you... are one of them."

If so, in this jubilee of hope, why not give faith another go. Open up to God with your frustrations and fears and give him a little chance to whisper his words of hope to you.

Sunday 6th July 2025 - The Mission in Action

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He said to them, "The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road. Whatever house you go into, let your



first words be, 'Peace to this house!' And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house. Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, 'The kingdom of God is very near to you'."
