Dear Families,

It's been a wonderful start to the academic year, and everyone seems to have settled in well for what I am sure will be another wonderful academic year at St Joseph's. Our newsletter will again be sent out every two to three weeks with as much helpful information as we can possibly provide. We have put in as many dates as possible up to half term initially. We will keep adding more as the term progresses. The PTA met this week, and they will also in turn correspond with parents regarding forthcoming events this term. The newsletter will as always coincide with our normal regular parent emails. We also will endeavour to keep parents abreast of what is happening by posting regularly on our Facebook page. Next week, I will also be sending out a parental survey. If parents could kindly complete this, it will help us in our decision making at the beginning of term.

As stipulated on many occasions, I cannot emphasise the importance of good attendance and punctuality for children at school. Tonight, all families will receive a letter outlining their child's attendance and the Trusts expectations regarding attendance. Like this year, this will be monitored every four weeks and parents will receive updated attendance letters. At this very early stage of the term, I have been particularly delighted with the reduction in term time holidays and how punctual our pupils are in the morning and with our overall attendance. Can I ask that any pupils that arrive after the 8:50 am gate closure are brought around in person to the main entrance by parents and guardians. I would appreciate also if parents would not drive cars into the staff car park for health and safety reasons unless they are disabled.

A new term is never easy for parents, so a big thank you from all of us at St Joseph's for preparing the children so well for their return to school. They all look very smart in their uniforms and have returned to school ready to learn. Can I remind parents that used uniform in great condition is available from Gateshead West Pre-Loved and can be collected from St Cuthbert's Community Hall. We again would appreciate it if parents could continue to support us over the next term with ensuring that your child has the correct PE kit and uniform and that it is fully labelled.

Fr Adrian has been in school on a number of occasions and looks forward to welcoming parents throughout the year to our class liturgies. The first Liturgy for Year 4 will be early October. Fr Adrian is also looking forward to seeing as many families as possible at our welcome mass on Tuesday 7th October at St Anne's Church at 10:00am.

Miss Graham, Mrs Lewis, Miss Carr and Mrs Callaghan would like to thank all our new nursery and reception parents for their support at the beginning of this new term, particularly in dropping pupils off in the morning. The children have quickly become independent in their first few weeks of school and

have settled in extremely quickly. We have a few nursery places still left, and I urge parents to contact school to complete a nursery admission form well in advance of your child's third birthday to avoid any disappointment.

If your child will be starting Reception class in September 2026 the window is now open to apply for school places www.gateshead.gov.uk/schooladmissions. Please can parents complete the Gateshead admissions form as early as possible. The window closes on 15th January 2026. Mr Naughton welcomes any Nursery and Reception parents that would like a personalised tour of the school throughout the Autumn Term, please ring the office to book a tour.

All of our clubs are now underway, and we have had a huge response. Clubs that have started this week include:

Although most clubs are during the day, can I ask that pupils dress in school PE kit for those clubs that are sports related not sportswear that is nonuniform. 

They have enjoyed settling into their new classroom with new teachers, exploring the different areas of provision and resources, and are continuing to build relationships with their classmates. In English we have been reading the story 'The Frog and the Prince' In the story the princess lost her golden ball. The children spent a lot of time working with their partner to think about a time where they may have lost something that is precious to them. We used the stem sentences 'Once I lost... I felt... and In the end I ...' to help our discussions.







Year 2

What a fantastic beginning we have had in Year 2! We have settled into our new classroom and have been very eager to start the new school year.

Through working as a team, we have supported everyone to feel valued and have created a whole class jigsaw with a new member of the class, Scout the adventure dog. The children have also been working well together during tag rugby in PE with Mr Morris and are thoroughly enjoying their music lessons where they have recorded responses to what they listen to with body language and drawings.



In English, we have been learning about the text 'Ruby's Worry' by Tom Percival, and we have advised the character Ruby on how to prevent her worry from growing. In connection to the importance of Catholic Education in mass this week, we have crafted a crayon design of Psalm 139, and the children impressed Miss Devereux with their knowledge on new beginnings; God, Jesus and what the cross means to them. We are very much looking forward to the rest of the school year and seeing what it has in store for us!











Year 3



Year 3 have had a great start to the new academic year. Moving from Key Stage 1 to Key Stage 2 has its challenges but the children have taken it in their stride. They have helped their new teacher plus two new classmates settle into St Joseph's with their warm and welcoming attitudes.



So far, we have enjoyed exploring The

Railway Children by E. Nesbit in our English lessons. We have been using

the first person to write a diary entry plus a letter of apology - it has been fun pretending to be Peter!

We are so excited to be learning French for the first time; we have begun our languages journey by practising les voyelles - the different vowel sounds used in French. Next, we will be learning to use personal pronouns in French and some adjectives.

Our Humanities topics are Rivers and Ancient Egypt - we really enjoyed hearing a story of Howard Carter and how he ended up discovering the tomb of Tutankhamun. In Geography, we are exploring the mighty River Indus and learning lots of new vocabulary.

There are many exciting things to look forward to in Year 3 - it's going to be a wonderful year!







Year 4

It has been a pleasure to welcome Year 4 back this term! We have had a fantastic start this September. We have settled in so well and made a great start across all areas of the curriculum.

In music, we have been looking at music which may be seen on TV. We started by looking at music which could represent the weather, we used a variety of instruments to portray different weather types. This week, we looked closely at foley artists and how they use different



techniques to recreate sounds to be used in media. We were then looked closely at news programme theme tunes and discussed how some sounds more serious than others. We had to create a number of headlines which we could play an appropriate theme tune over. It was a fantastic lesson with Mr Angus, and we are all thoroughly enjoying music!

In history, we have had been studying the Roman Republic. We have been looking at the formation of Rome following the legend of Romulus and Remus.

We have then been learning about how they set up their republic after having seven kings. There has been a lot of exciting facts and discussion about battles during the expansion of the Roman Republic, including the Punic Wars. It has all been very interesting and we are looking forward to learning about what happened next!







Year 5

Year 5 have had a fantastic start to the year and have been settling into routines these last few weeks.


They've really enjoyed their new English text, Holes and have really impressed Mrs Douglas by applying their handwriting skills.

Sunday 21st September 2025 - The Dishonest Steward

Jesus said to his disciples, "There was a rich man, and he had a steward who was denounced to him for being wasteful with his property. He called for the man and said, 'What is this I hear about you? Draw me up an account of your stewardship because you are not to be my steward any longer.' Then the steward said to himself, 'Now that my master is taking the stewardship from me, what am I to do? Dig? I am not strong enough. Go begging? I should be too ashamed. Ah, I know what I will do to make sure that when I am dismissed from office there will be some to welcome me into their homes.' Then he called his master's debtors one by one. To the first he said, 'How much do you owe my master?' 'One

hundred measures of oil,' was the reply. The steward said, 'Here, take your bond; sit down straight away and write fifty.' To another he said, 'And you, sir, how much do you owe?' 'One hundred measures of wheat,' was the reply. The steward said, 'Here, take your bond and write eighty.' The master praised the dishonest steward for his astuteness. For the children of this world are more astute in dealing with their own kind than are the children of light. And so I tell you this: use money, tainted as it is, to win you



friends, and thus make sure that when it fails you, they will welcome you into the tents of eternity. The man who can be trusted in little things can be trusted in great; the man who is dishonest in little things will be dishonest in great. If then you cannot be trusted with money, that tainted thing, who will trust you with genuine riches? And if you cannot be trusted with what is not yours, who will give you what is your very own? No servant can be the slave of two masters: he will either hate the first and love the second or treat the first with respect and the second with scorn. You cannot be the slave both of God and of money."
