## **Nursery & Reception**



What a wonderful term our lovely nursery and reception are having.

In both classes we have been thinking about the season of autumn. We have read the book 'The Leaf Man' and have both been on leaf hunts. We were categorising the leaves into small, medium and large. The children loved looking at the different colours, shapes and sizes. Reception have made leaves in the play dough and nursery are busy making leaf men in class.

In reception we have been focusing on becoming fluent in knowing our letter sounds. We have set up lots of fun provision activities for both classes to help us such as a clean-up activity using spray bottles, hiding letters in the sand and using the paint brushes to find them and sorting conkers into the correct letter tubs.

Reception have also started blending their letter sounds to read and make

words. They are doing brilliantly.

The children have all settled beautifully and are becoming more and more independent. We are so proud of them all!











#### Year 1

In English, the children have been reading the story 'I want my hat back' by Jon Klassen. Last week we used drama to bring the story to life, taking on different characters and exploring the narrative through performance. They imagined how the characters may have felt at different parts during the story as well as how they may have moved









In RE we have been learning about family. We have thought about how our homes are safe, welcoming and loving places. We thanked God for this and thought about the message he shares with us. We understood that God always shows us love and care and as he does, he asks us and our families to do the same. We shared our ideas and our experience of what makes a home a lovely place and thought about how our families love and care for us. We shared a moment of quiet reflection during circle time and placed a building block onto our focal point to show how they are a stone for us, strong, sturdy and dependable.









Year 2

We had a lovely reward trip to Saltwell Park! The children had lots of fun finding each other in the maze; meeting peacocks and parrots at Pet's Corner, spotting wildlife at the lake and playing games at the different parks.

As we connect our learning to our new mascot, Patariki the Penguin, Year 2 have been participating in different activities and are working really well as a team. In science, the children created a class Bug Hotel, and they enjoyed discovering and assembling natural resources to make a perfect shelter for minibeasts. Furthermore, the children are thriving in Just Dance Club, and we also perform dance within class, so the children have the opportunity to practice their dance moves to their



favourite songs with all of their friends.

Well done Year 2, we are very proud of you!

















Year 3 are continuing to work very hard. We have enjoyed reading the poem From a Railway Carriage by Robert Louis Stephenson; we learnt about rhyming couplets and planned our own versions of the poem. We are now reading Charlotte's Web - the children are loving getting to know the characters of Fern and Wilbur.

In Maths, we have been exploring patterns when we add and subtract 1s, 10s and 100s. We are doing



really well at explaining our thinking in Maths.

Our PE lessons with Mr Morris are so much fun - we have been learning the rules and playing Tag rugby.



Our first RE topic was all about homes and families. We thought carefully about how we can live as God's People, and we created recipes for a loving family. Each week, groups of children have planned and led acts of worship for the rest of the class. They

have chosen prayers, hymns and actions to help us to reflect on Sunday's Gospel.



## Year 4

Year 4 have been working really hard in computing. They have been using the programming language Scratch to create an interesting and enjoyable game. They have created a variety of algorithms to create the game whilst using variables for control.







The Year 4 children over the last few weeks have been creating their own liturgies. They choose the hymns, prayers and how to respond to the Gospel reading.







Year 5

What a lovely few weeks we've had in year 5!

The children absolutely loved the Majesticks Little Sticks Golf Festival in Sunderland. They learnt new skills and were inspired by professional golfers. It was a lovely morning.

On Friday afternoons, the children have continued to deliver our class-led Collective Worship. They have used the gospel and have thought about linked hymns, prayers and actions. They have been beautiful. In science, they really enjoyed dissecting eggs, looking at the different parts and their properties.

Some of the children have found addition and subtraction difficult this week, but the lesson writing their calculations on the table really engaged and motivated them, and they are understanding the concepts much more now!













Year 6



Year 6 had a fantastic afternoon of rugby provided by Gateshead School Sports Partnership at Winlaton Vulcans' ground. We came joint third and won 6 badges for sporting values. Well done everyone!

In the classroom, we have enjoyed a science practical investigating how the size of blood vessels affects blood flow.



We used straws to model this, took careful measurements and drew our own conclusions. We also held a trial for the father of the Prodigal Son, accused of not showing unconditional love. It was nail-biting!

Class collective worships have continued, and the children led a beautiful welcome Mass at St Anne's to mark the beginning of a new academic year. Stunning!

## Sunday 12th October 2025 - The Samaritan Leper

On the way to Jerusalem Jesus travelled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As he entered one of the villages, ten lepers came to meet him. They stood some way off and called to him, "Jesus!

Master! Take pity on us." When he saw them he said, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." Now as they were going away they were cleansed. Finding himself cured, one of them turned back praising God at the top of his voice and threw himself at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. The man was a Samaritan. This made Jesus say, "Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they? It seems that no one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner." And he said to the man, "Stand up and go on your way. Your faith has saved you."
